## A Message from the Superintendent:

The 2018-2019 school year has come to an end and our students once again had a great year academically and in their many activities they can participate in at North Platte.

On May 12, an excited crowd watched 45 seniors graduate from North Platte. They consistently were a group that had strong participation and excelled in many areas of their academics and activities. They will be remembered as an outstanding class that represented the North Platte community well throughout their years in the district.

The North Platte Foundation Golf Tourney was recently held on June 7 at Shiloh Springs Golf Course in Platte City. The proceeds from this tournament directly benefit our students at North Platte by providing funds to generate scholarships for our graduates to utilize as they pursue their post-secondary education. The summer is traditionally a time where we complete several renovations and upgrades throughout the summer. This summer's schedule will include upgrades in our weight room at
the Dearborn campus, refinishing the gym floor in the junior high, restoring the new junior high building to new construction quality after one year of use, installing a drain line to facilitate better drainage at the elementary school, and normal annual repainting and recovery of each facility.

Another upgrade that will occur this summer is the implementation of a new website. This will include a more modernized appearance and new features. Along with this we will be converting over to a new text alert system and we will also be adding a school app that will allow for several new school related options and informational techniques. More information will be coming out from the district on these developments as we near their implementation.

Summer school has begun for grades K -8th at the Elementary School in Camden Point. Summer school will continue through June 28. If your child is not attending but you would like them to you can still sign up by calling the Elementary school at (816) 450-3511.

In the month of May, all grade levels attended their individual field trips. The third grade students went to Fort Osage National Historic Landmark and learned about how the fort functioned as an outpost in the newly acquired Louisiana Purchase, housing soldiers to guard the new territory and to protect the United States Factory Trade House there.
